INTERSTATE 238 CLOSURES TO CONTINUE: All lanes in both directions of Interstate 238 will be closed nearly every night through Friday, to facilitate Caltrans construction in the area.

The connector will close from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. most nights, with the exception of Sunday, when no work was performed, and Monday night, when lanes were closed at midnight to facilitate traffic departing the Raiders game at the Oakland-Alameda County Coliseum.

Signs will route traffic off the freeway at Hesperian Boulevard for northbound drivers, Lewelling Boulevard for those going south. Mission Boulevard will be used to connect with Interstate 580 on-ramps near Castro Valley Boulevard.

INTERSTATE 880 CLOSURE AT ROUTE 92: An early morning closure of northbound Interstate 880 at State Route 92 from 1 a.m. to 5 a.m. will continue Wednesday to facilitate Caltrans construction.

Motorists driving north

on I-880 will exit at Jackson Street, taking a detour along Santa Clara Street to the Winton Avenue onramp. The eastbound Route 92 connector to I-880 will also be closed. Vehicles will be diverted off the freeway and take Hesperian Boulevard to Winton.
