BURGLARY ARREST: Two teens are in custody after police responded to a report Tuesday afternoon of a

woman chasing two youths, one of whom was carrying a rifle case.

The teen with the case was spotted getting into a red 1992 Acura Integra about 5 p.m. after exiting an apartment complex near the Fremont Hub, police said.

A license plate search of the car led police to a nearby apartment in the 39400 block of Parkhurst Drive, where one of the teens was spotted walking with the case.

A short foot chase ended after the suspect dropped off the case at an apartment complex in the 39400 block of Stratton Common, Detective Bill Veteran said.

One teen was arrested

at the apartment, where officers found two stolen rifles hidden under a bed mattress, police said.

Officers then set up a perimeter and found the second suspect walking at the intersection Sundale and Coco Palm drives.

Police arrested Jamon Baptiste Ward, 18, of Richmond, and a 15-year-old boy, of Fremont, on suspicion of burglary.

Ward is being held at Fremont City Jail; the teen, whose identity was not released because of his age, is being held at Alameda County Juvenile Hall in San Leandro.
